

JUNIOR TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIPS

ITFs fund young neurologists in training or early in their career from countries classified by the World Bank as low- or lower-middle-income, to attend approved international meetings.



NEUROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT VISITS

Supporting young neurologists from Africa, Asia, and Central and South America to spend 4-6 weeks at neurological departments of other institutions outside of their home country.



WFN TRAINING CENTRES

Training centres empower regions by providing primary and sub-specialty training to visiting fellows and neurology residents, and enhance local training through accreditation.





GRANTS & AWARDS

Educational Grants-In-Aid

Each year, WFN awards educational grants to projects that advance brain health through research or education.

WCN Bursaries

Bursaries offer free registration and travel grant to selected young neurologists who wish to attend the World Congress of Neurology.



GLOBAL ADVOCACY LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

'GALP' is organised in partnership with the AAN, training young neurologists from low- and lower-middle-income countries in advocacy, commication and leadership.



AAN-WFN CONTINUUM PROGRAMME

This program provides free print and online access to "Continuum: Lifelong Learning in Neurology" to support neurology education in 40+ countries with limited resources.

RTC's are organized for young neurologists, nurses, and paramedical professionals, in collaboration with the EAN and the AAN in sub-Saharan Africa.
