Throughout her life, Dame Cicely Saunders had conceded that patients with neurologic and neurodegenerative diseases had a difference from oncology patients when it came to end-of-life care.

Main Challenges for Neuropalliative Care in Europe

- Not many neurologists have palliative care education
- Too less patients with neurolgical symptoms are included in palliative care services
- Diagnose Dying in neurological units in Germany
- Palliative care units only rarely take care for neurological patients
- Hospices restrict numbers of neurolgical patients
- To less education and workshops


